Old CN Yard re-development

I have participated in all the consultations, questions and concerns of the citizens of Montreal. Like many of them I am rather sceptical that consultations or memos are anything else then compulsory procedures that are then ardently ignored.

In June 2006 M Chiara bought the CN yards for one dollar with the understanding that he would decontaminate the land. It has become quite clear since then that he has not intentions of doing so.
