Mandate

On July 27, 2018, the City Clerk's Office received, pursuant to the Right of Initiative, a petition calling for a public consultation on systemic racism and discrimination, which it deemed conform following the validation of over 16,700 signatures.

Objectives of the consultation



To stimulate public discussion promoting the emergence of constructive, innovative and mobilising proposals.



To assess the state of affairs concerning intercultural relations, inclusion policies and the fight against discrimination in areas under the jurisdiction of the City of Montréal.



To identify current of promising initiatives, and to recommend new ones. To identify obstacles, challenges and conditions for success.

To draw a portrait of citizens' expectations regarding these issues.



To recommend follow-up measures to the City.


What is systemic discrimination?


SYSTEMIC discrimination is discrimination resulting from the dynamic interaction between decisions and attitudes that are tinged with prejudice, as well as from organizational models and institutional practices that have prejudicial effects (intended or not) on groups protected by the Québec charter of Human Rights and Freedoms.

Example: The under-representation of some visible minorities in employment sectors and executive or management positions may be the result of systemic discrimination.

The grounds of discrimination prohibited by the Charter include race, colour, sex, gender identity or expression, pregnancy, sexual orientation, civil status, age, religion, political convictions, language, ethnic or national origin, social condition, a disability or the use of any means to palliate a disability.
