

The Montreal Children's Library Who are we? What are we about?

- A unique not-for-profit community library where « any child can discover the magic of literacy, where imaginations flourish, and where learning is fun ».
- Since 1929, we have been continuously serving the Montreal community.
- We inspire kids! We are « the little library that does big things for little kids ».





The Montreal Children's Library

- We encourage literacy by providing all children with free library services, diverse and innovative programs, within a safe and welcoming environment
- Our outreach programs are dedicated to filling specific needs within the various communities.





The Montreal Children's Library

- ■The **Atwater Branch** serves many young immigrant families with good parent involvement.
- ■It is also the location of the MCL's Administrative Offices.
- ■We have 3956 members at the branch!





Activities include:

- 39 weeks of **storytimes** for pre-schoolers (twice a week)
- 39 weeks of **after school** activities for children ages 6-12 (including help with homework, reference resource, science club, chess club with mentor, and arts and crafts).
- **Special events** including puppet workshops, children's theatre, music and song, author visits and illustrator visits, etc.
- Storytime visits for the local Daycares (including 12 from the Ville-Marie Borough)
- Outreach programs to the Montreal Children's Hospital, Montreal Diet Dispensary, Oral School For The Deaf, etc



Summer Activities in Cabot Park:

- ■2008: 10 weeks = **1667 children** attended
 - (4 days/wk)
- **■**2009: 6 weeks = **3013 children** attended
 - (4 days/wk)
- **2**010: 5 weeks = **1305** attended
 - (3 days for 3 wks + 2 days for 2 wks)






We count on the Ville Marie Borough for funding the summer park activities.

- •Full funding allows longer sessions with more programs for older kids
- ■We want to provide additional activities for school age kids
- ■Partial funding reduces the summer park activities we can afford
- ■We have to plan summer activities well in advance
- ■The Pepsi Forum is our only 'rainy day' space they have been very generous
- ■Imagine what we could do with our own real space in the park!







- Renovations to the Atwater Library are reducing the amount of space we've rented for 30 years.
- Atwater has offered other, smaller basement space for the same rent we currently pay.
- A larger basement space is available but we can't pay the higher rent.

Montreal Children's Library Short Term Goal

- We request a subsidy from the Ville Marie Borough to cover the amount of the rent increase for the bigger basement space at Atwater Library.
- This will help the MCL to function better, by providing some storage space for program supplies, and for books that are being catalogued.

- We have a dream, a VISION, for a free-standing Montreal Children's Library In The Park, specifically in Cabot Square
- The MCL would animate and energize Cabot Square, helping to heal it during its transition to a family park full of children, laughter, and activities for all
- We envision a sustainably-designed showcase ecolibrary in colours that inspire kids and with a healthy and exciting connection to nature for all children







MCL Long Term Goal: Our own library in the park

Proposal:

1.We ask that the Ville Marie Borough consider making available to the Montreal Children's Library, on a permanent basis, a piece of land either in Cabot Park proper, or on the land used as an outdated and relatively unused bus collector lane at the east end of Cabot Park, so that an independent children's library can be built and enjoyed by the children of the Borough and their families and friends.

2.We also ask that Ville Marie supply us with some seed money to grow a proper campaign to raise the funds necessary to build a wonderful children's library « IN THE PARK », one that will benefit the entire community, and will help keep young families in the area and young teens from dropping out of school.

- ■We would be pleased to share our suggestions with you based on our experiences with kids.




