Introduction

The City of Montréal plans to initiate a Special Planning Program (SPP) for the western sector of downtown bounded by Atwater street to the west, Bishop street to the east, Sherbrooke street to the north, and the Ville-Marie autoroute to the south. The three main goals of the proposed Planning Program are:

- **To improve the quality of living environments** by increasing the provision of green spaces, consolidating residential use, and establishing a local sustainable development strategy;
- **To protect and enhance** the area's architectural heritage, its institutions, gardens, housing, and exceptional urban landscapes;
- **To support economic activity** by revitalizing the western sector of Sainte-Catherine Street.

The various initiatives proposed by the City of Montréal include the creation of a new park, establishing measures to promote public access to institutional gardens, redeveloping Cabot square, providing incentives to renovate large apartment buildings, "greening" several of the area's streets, and facilitating pedestrian circulation.
