

Sir, Ms.,

I wish to propose the creation of a department of municipal government that will deal with the evolution of 'Attractions' in the city and its burroughs. Life, especially in the suburbs, has stagnated and people are looking for more interesting environments than shopping malls. Generally there is a lack of creativity in the public domain.

A graduate of McGill Architecture I have for twenty-five years explored the potential development of an improved commercial and recreational sector.

We need places where individuals can contribute to the development of community assets. Space should be made available for creative exhibition and decorative growth, since the available commercial space is expensive and often inhibits the free and democratic expression of our citizens. We need spaces where our cultural groups can meet without being allied to specific concerns so that we can discuss issues of common interest.

I propose several types of original community structures and spaces:

- (1) DEMOCRATIC HALLS:Community expression
- (2) CONDOMUSEUMS:Geneological expression
- (3) DECROBOARDWALKS:Personal artistic expressions
- (4) BURROUGH 'ATTRACTION'S:Thematic communication
- (5) PERFORMANCE CENTRES:Collective theatrical expression and talent exposed
- (6) RUE PRINCIPAL AUDITORIUMS:Year round street animation and expression.

I will elaborate on this input at hearings and at a future date.
